#### **Academic Results 2015**

Academic attainment is of course, the main focus of our work. Whilst we are committed to the development of the whole child, students' academic qualifications are the ticket to the next stage of their education. The class of 2015 was a hardworking and dedicated group of young people and attained results of which we are exceptionally proud. The year group made the most progress from their starting points of any year group in the last five years at the school – a remarkable achievement.

We think that success in the classroom goes hand-in-hand with an enjoyment and commitment to the whole of school life. This group of students took part in all there is to offer at Debenham High School, from charity work to extra-curricular activities.

As a high achieving, academic school, students take a largely traditional curriculum with subjects such as Science, History and Languages – considered key indicators of success by Universities and many employers.

### **Key indicators for 2015**

- Of all examinations taken by 130 students, a remarkable 34% of grades awarded were A\* or A.
- 68% of students achieved 5A\*-C grades including English and Mathematics.
- 34% of students achieved the English Baccalaureate (A\*-C grade in English, Mathematics, Science, a Humanities and a Modern Foreign Language Debenham High School does not have a policy of all students being forced to take this combination so this percentage is reflective of the proportion of students who have taken this set of qualifications. The national average for this measure is 23.9%)

Levels of progress (from Key Stage 2):

- 84% of students achieved at least 3 levels of progress in English
   48% achieved at least 4 levels of progress.
- 76% of students achieved at least 3 levels of progress in Mathematics
   55% achieved at least 4 levels of progress.
