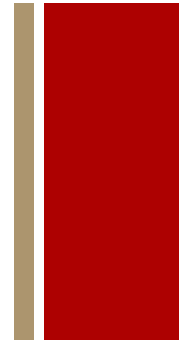
+ Make-up – why is it accepted that women wear this?

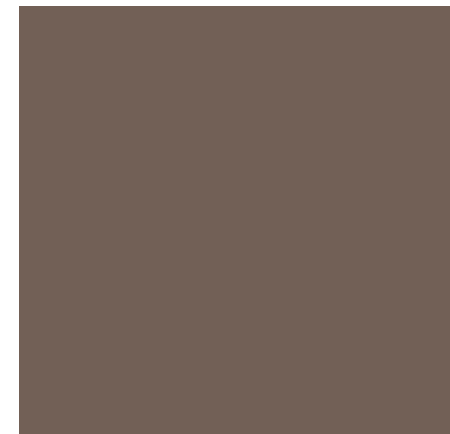
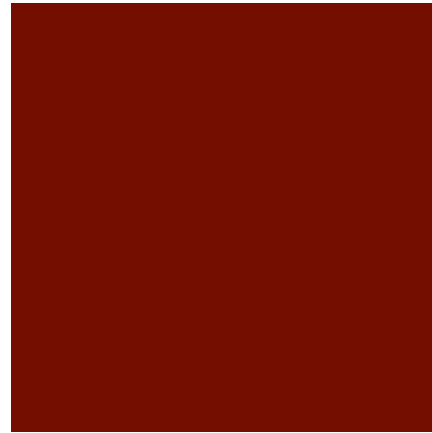
